

Seigfreid Bingham gains victory in Apollo 11 artifact case

✖ Houston, Texas – A ruling in federal court on February 24, 2017 ordered that a lunar bag used to carry moon rocks back from the Apollo 11 mission be returned to its rightful owner, Seigfried Bingham client, Nancy Lee Carlson. A previous ruling named Carlson as rightful owner of the bag, which she purchased in a online government auction for \$995. After sending the bag, which contained particles of moon dust to NASA for authentication, the mistake of the sale was realized and the bag, which has been deemed a “national treasure” and important artifact of American history, was not returned.
